## **INTRODUCTION**

All Praise is for Allah , Lord and Sustainer of all the worlds, for giving us the hidāya to write this book. This book consists of three main parts:

(a) The 99 Asmā' Allāh ul-Husnā,

- (b) The 201 Asmā' un-Nabī that appear prior to the text of <u>Dalā'il ul-Khayrāt</u>, and
- (c) A Dictionary of 401 Asmā' and Sifāt un-Nabī that we have compiled.

This Dictionary consists of:

- (i) The Asmā' un-Nabi <sup>26</sup>/<sub>26</sub> that appear both in the text of the <u>Dalā'il</u> as well as in the list of 201. We have marked these in the Dictionary with an asterisk.
- (ii) The additional Asmā' and Sifāt un-Nabī  $\xrightarrow{\text{MS}}$  that appear only in the text of the <u>Dalā'il</u> but not in the list of 201. These have not been marked with an asterisk.
- (iii) The Asmā' un-Nabī <sup>105</sup>/<sub>105</sub> that are only in the list of 201 but do not occur in the text. These have been shown as: from 201 Asma' un-Nabi.

This dictionary of Asmā' and Sifāt un-Nabī is not exhaustive. A total of 401 Asmā' and Sifāt un-Nabī have been selected. The entries in this dictionary are arranged in alphabetical order in accordance with the Arabic language. However, if the singular and plural forms of the same word appear one after the other, the singular form has been placed first, regardless of the alphabetical order.
